Turbulent Times

After a very successful season post-pandemic there will be some changes this year. Our new Chairman, Dominic Urand, and the committee have worked very hard with Matthew to ensure that these are positive and lead the society in the right direction. However 2022 has proved quite turbulent in several unforeseen ways, which will mean major changes for the Society going forward.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAIRMAN Rehearsal and performance

Ashford School, our rehearsal venue for many years, will no longer be allowing external users access to their facilities due to changes in their Safeguarding Policy. This decision came completely out of the blue and despite strong representations we were unable to change their decision – although they did allow us to stay and finish rehearsals for the May concert, which was a small concession! This is a shame but does present us with the opportunity to move to a new venue that suits our needs well.

As members will be aware, the difficulties of finding a suitable rehearsal space around Ashford considerable - many suitable facilities are already booked for Tuesday nights, or cost a great deal more than our rent for Ashford School.

Matthew was keen that the main criterion was for a space with a good acoustic. The Brake Hall provided plenty of room but the very high ceiling did mean that it was difficult to hear other parts singing.

After looking at various locations, it has been decided that our new rehearsal space will be St Mary the Virgin, Church Road, Willesborough. It is, by a significant margin, the most cost-effective option and is currently used as a rehearsal and concert venue by Ashford Sinfonia and Invicta Singers.

I am very aware that this is a significant change and that change is not always easy. Parking at Willesborough is less plentiful. Though Willesborough Medical Centre's car park (behind the church) will be available to us, some people will need to park considerately on roads near the church. We suggest a dry run before rehearsals begin on 6 September to work out the best route and check out parking.

I would also strongly encourage members to car share to reduce car usage and congestion. Of course if you have issues or concerns about the venue please speak to me or Virginia so the committee can fully consider your concerns or help overcome any issues.

On top of the problem of weekly rehearsal space, the Society has also had to contend with a post-Covid change of management at the Gulbenkian. The choral risers in the Colyer-Fergusson are being taken out of use and a large raised stage is being installed on the floor of the hall. This is, of course, extremely disappointing but please be assured that the Committee are working hard to find another, comparable performance space and approaches have been made to Saga Pavilion and elsewhere. The hope is to be able to return to Canterbury at some point in the future. We will keep members informed as to developments.

In view of the loss of Colyer-Fergusson, it is fortunate that the Society has a long-term, friendly relationship with Wye Church where the organ has recently been completely refurbished - so for the time being the Society will perform at Wye Church. This, to an extent, dictates what can be performed – but seating standing arrangements are under active and consideration by the committee to ensure the Society continues to perform as professionally as possible.

Members will also note that our regular Christmas Carol Concert will be at Wye this year. This is because we were unable to book a Saturday in December at St Mary's Ashford, despite contacting them in good time. The space at Wye will enable us to provide seating, something that was never possible at St Mary's.

The new Season programme

With our new rehearsal and performance spaces now secured, we can look forward to performing under Matthew's bâton some well-known works, as well as a piece - the Vierne Messe Solennelle - which the Society has never sung before. Haydn's Creation which we were due to sing under Paul Young in May 2020 - also makes a welcome return to our programme.
