# **Programme 2021/22**

After one of the longest breaks in the Society's history, including the two world wars, we return in September to rehearsals for a full concert programme.

The first major work is Haydn's so-called Nelson Mass. Haydn actually titled his work Missa in Angustiis – a Mass for troubled times. This might therefore be thought appropriate for the times we have lived through though perhaps they are not as anguished as 1798 when Austria, where Haydn was living, faced annihilation by Napoleon's army. Nelson's victory at the Battle of the Nile later in 1798 gave much needed hope to the allies against Napoleon – hence the better-known title for the Mass.

The Mass will be performed alongside two of Handel's joyous Coronation anthems and Pergolesi's ecstatic Magnificat.

We will then rehearse for our beloved and traditional carol concert in December - hoping to make up for no Christmas carols last year!

# **Subscriptions**

Those who were existing members in 2019–20 will be entitled to renew their membership for the 2021–22 season at £76 – which provides compensation for the lost months of their full subscription for that season.

The society welcomes new members of all ages and abilities – so if you have friends, family or colleagues who have been thinking about joining a choir, bring them along. There is no charge for the first two rehearsals and scores will be made available free of charge.

For new members joining from September 2021, the annual subscription is £96 – whilst under 25s join for free.

All subscriptions are due in September, preferably by BACs online banking or standing order rather than by cheque or cash payment since there is a cost to the Society of banking these.
