Fundraising by committee members

Dominic and Matthew recently submitted a successful application to the Kent Community Fund for funds towards our November concert. Meanwhile Julia has secured a grant for new Christmas music from Ashford Federation of the Arts. A significant sum was raised by our first ever quiz evening, organised by Manou and Rachel. These efforts enable us to continue to stage high quality concerts with orchestra without having to raise the membership fee still higher.

As a very old Choral Society we are constantly evolving and new ideas and talent are always welcome.

FUNDRAISING

Small actions make a big financial contribution to the Society – for example each week members have the to buy wonderful homemade opportunity jam, marmalade, cakes and fresh eggs. These are made and brought along by long-term Society members, Ruth Foster (soprano) and Joyce Owen (alto). Last year, together with ACS tote bag sales, the produce stall raised over £600.Please do keep supporting by buying cakes, eggs, marmalade, jam and ACS bags.

In addition, the weekly raffle, run by Rachel Cook (soprano), contributes significantly to Society funds – raising £1130 last year. So please keep buying your weekly tickets. Talk to Rachel if you have items or ideas for raffle prizes. Rachel also welcomes donations so that she can buy suitable items for the raffle. All these things help keep the Society alive for the future.

MEMBERSHIP SUBSCRIPTION

From September 2023, to secure the future of the society, we raised the annual subscription to £144. The subscription represents excellent value. Each week we rehearse with a professional accompanist – not a backing tape – and every member has the opportunity to participate in concerts at a very high level, in good venues, with a professional orchestra and soloists.

The annual subscription (under 25s go free) can be paid in one amount or split into monthly or quarterly instalments, provided that some payment is received by 30 September 2024.

SUCCESS OF THE FIRST QUIZ NIGHT

The first ever ACS quiz, held at St Mary's Church on May 10th, was open to all. Members of the choir, friends and quiz amateurs came in droves, filling 14 tables of 6. Phil Sibbald was a lively compère, sharing questions and pictures over 9 varied rounds, promoting the raffle and leading a game of heads and tails.



The quiz and the raffle raised over £770 for the choir. Watch this space for the date of the next quiz to be held in spring 2025.

SINGING WORKSHOP



The 2nd singing workshop, in July, was an opportunity to welcome potential new members and for current members to try a different style of music. This year's theme was opera choruses, with pieces as varied as Dido's Lament and final chorus – Purcell, Chorus of the Hebrew Slaves – Verdi, Humming Chorus – Puccini, Pilgrims' Chorus – Wagner and many more.

CHRISTMAS CAROL CONCERT CHARITIES

At our annual carol concert, the retiring collection is divided equally between two chosen charities. This is supplemented by donations raised on an evening of carol singing when a small choir is invited to sing at three or four house parties. Sums raised usually top $\pounds1,000$. HENRY URAND - PARIS PARALYMPIAN

If you think singing the Amen in C.P.E. Bach's Magnificat is a marathon, think of the stamina and breath control needed by Chairman Dominic Urand's son, Henry, who has just returned from participating in the Paris Paralympics with Team GB.

This was the first time Henry had taken part in the Paralympics and he finished fourth in the PTS3 triathlon – one tantalising minute behind the bronze medal winner.

Cheered on by Dominic and his family, Henry swam 750m (in the Seine), cycled 20km, followed by a final 5km run. His timing for the whole event was 1 hr 10 minutes 24 seconds – the bronze winner's time being 1 hr 9 minutes 24 seconds.

Despite only making his paratriathlon debut in 2023, Henry had enjoyed a meteoric rise to qualify for the men's PTS3 race in Paris. He earned his selection with six podium finishes in nine races. His final outing before this summer's games was in Montreal where he won a gold medal at the world triathlon para series.

Henry Urand had already made his mark on the international stage in paratriathlon in his debut season, winning gold at the world triathlon cup in Taranto in 2023. Prior to that he was an accomplished para cyclist and was a part of British Cycling's para-cycling development programme.

What a fantastic achievement! We look forward to seeing what else Henry will achieve in the coming years – Los Angeles 2028??
